

#### SECTION ONE: Reading in the 5th Position - Strings 3 & 2

#### **POSITION 5 - Overview:**

The fifth position allows for excellent scale tone placement and ease of playability for pieces in the following keys:




Fifth position also works as an excellent compliment to Position Four.

#### 5th Position - Second String Note Layout:

Example one below shows the notes of: E, F, and G in the fifth position on the second string.

**IMPORTANT:** Throughout this course, circled numbers represent guitar strings. Numbers next to tones represent the fret-board hand finger used to play the specific tone.

Example #1). Fifth position, second string notes.



24-Note Drill: Perform the 24 notes as; quarter, eighth, and sixteenth-note durations.





**IMPORTANT:** Notes from fifth positions third guitar string are technically located within the fourth position on the fingerboard.
